She encouraged the Iyalode to continue her sterling work, and motivate the younger women to higher pedestal.

Iyalode Alaba Lawson also attended the US-Nigeria Agribusiness Investment Summit (USNAGRIS-2017), at Hilton Atlanta Airport Hotel, where she delivered a paper on "Agribusiness Opportunities and interdependence in Global and Local Markets – the need for re-awakening"
